Message from the Executive Director

Earlier this year, states that accepted additional federal Medicaid funding during the pandemic began unwinding the requirement that all Medicaid enrollees receive continuous coverage until the end of the COVID-19 public health emergency.

In the state of Ohio, as of October 2023, 74% of enrollees with completed renewals are still eligible for Medicaid and have retained their coverage, while 19% were disenrolled for procedural reasons (e.g., the renewal process was not completed) and 7% were found ineligible for Medicaid.

The Ohio Department of Medicaid found that, in July 2023, more than half (53%) of the enrollees who were disenrolled for procedural reasons were identified as likely ineligible for Medicaid coverage. As a result, free charitable health clinics have seen an increase in volumes and services provided. In this report we have illustrated the increase in volumes we have experienced at Grace Clinics of Ohio.

Grace Clinics have over 204 volunteers and I am extremely grateful for our prayer partners, providers, pharmacists, nurses, interpreters, front desk personnel, and many others that make the clinics run smoothly. It is only through their time and treasures that the clinics can serve others.

Thank you for sharing your gifts with Grace Clinics of Ohio. I greatly appreciate your partnership and generosity. The year 2023 was a year of growth, transition, and God was glorified through the free medical care provided to our patients. May 2024 be a year where we can continue to serve and show others the love of Jesus. It takes a village; I am thankful for the Grace Clinics of Ohio village of volunteers and employees.

Dr. James Dorado has served as a volunteer physician with Grace Clinics of Ohio for 15 years. He also serves on the organization's Board of Directors and the Fundraising Committee and supports the clinic in all facets of operations, from Board service to volunteer physician, to securing sponsors and donors for successful fundraising events. In addition, Dr. Dorado and his wife created the Run 4 the Health Of It charity event, raising over \$350,000 to help the underserved.

Dorado joined the nation's largest physician-owned primary care organization, Central Ohio Primary Care (COPC), in 2000. He remains a full-time primary-care physician and serves in multiple administrative roles, including COPC's Board of Directors and its charitable Foundation.



Patient Impact

When Roger (not his real name) walked into the Delaware office, he couldn't afford to buy a can of soda, but by the time he left, Roger felt like a rich man.

Amanda Haines, Lead Nurse for Grace Clinics reported that Roger told her he had 75 cents to his name. He was homeless, living on the streets of Delaware. He was a diabetic who could not get the medication he needed nor the ability to see a doctor. Amanda said "He was so touched by all the things we helped him with, it brought him to tears. He could not believe someone he met that day would care so much about him."

"It's really awesome to work in a place that allows us to give back to the people in the community. We can meet people where they are and care for them. While doing that, we get to share the good news of Jesus. It truly fills our cup daily, and our patients are so thankful the clinic exists," reports Amanda.

The history of Grace Clinics began in 2006 when Amanda's twin uncles, Dr. Kent Doherty, and Dr. Kevin Doherty, with a helping hand from the Grace Powell Church, formed the Grace Clinic in Delaware. They wanted to meet a need in the community for people who couldn't afford their deductibles or who had medical needs but lacked health insurance. Amanda reported their goal was

Roger's medical, spiritual, and physical needs were met that day. Members of a local Bible study provided Roger with a hot meal. The doctor on call wrote prescriptions for everything Roger needed to treat his diabetes and the clinic's onsite pharmacy then provided all the needed medicine.

"...He could not believe someone he met that day would care so much about him." "to take care of anybody who walks through our doors, no questions asked; to remove all the barriers so people could show up and get the quality medical care they needed, completely free. The entire mission of Grace Clinics is to lead people to Christ by offering them free medical care."

While Roger was being treated, he confided to the staff that he had a job interview in two days but had no place to sleep until then. It was pouring down rain and cold when Roger left the clinic. The doctor who treated him that day felt convicted to be returning to his warm house, when this guy didn't have any place to stay. He decided to drive around the city of Delaware to find him, which he did, and gave him the gift of a warm and dry two-night stay in a hotel.

Currently there are 204 medical and administrative volunteers, most who have practices and/or full-time jobs, who generously donate their time. All, staff and volunteers, agree that it's stories like this that make it easy to work and volunteer at Grace Clinics.

Since the beginning the clinics have increased to five locations, adding Linden, Marion, Wellston, and Hilliard to the original clinic in Delaware.

People are always hurting, whether it's through financial situations, their health, or experiencing dark times and feelings of hopelessness. There's always pain; there's always sin. God calls us to look for these people so we may help them, take them under our wings, and show them Jesus.

If one patient has taught Amanda this, it was Roger. Months after he came to the clinic that rainy day, Roger returned with a plate of cookies. "He just thanked us from the bottom his heart," Amanda remembered. He said "I'm not really sure what I would have done because I was getting very sick without some of my medications. Essentially, you saved my life."
